

Albury War Memorial World War I Honour Roll

An Albury Honour Roll for World War I was compiled for *March of the Veterans, The proud story of the City of Albury RSL Sub-Branch*, written by Howard C. Jones and published in 2014. The listed names are commemorated on plaques at the Albury War Memorial.

Several omissions have come to light since the book was published and the plaques laid. The missing names have been added to the list below and are marked with an asterisk.

Names for inclusion on plaques were researched for the RSL by two respected members, John Neale and Jim Kennedy, in the 1990s. They drew on previous rolls published in newspapers and elsewhere. With the lapse of time since 1918 omissions were inevitable. The chief consideration for inclusion was that a man had to have been an Albury resident at the time of enlistment. Some men were included although not strictly residents but lived in Hume Shire at places such as Lavington or Bungowannah. Others included may have lived elsewhere but attended school or church in Albury. Some had only a loose family connection to the town.
